ASQ and ASQ:SE

Purpose: To obtain a comprehensive view of a child's educational and developmental growth, screening assessments are completed and scored within the first 45 days of enrollment and annually thereafter for children up to 60 months of age.

Procedure:

Screening Assessment	Developmental Domains Addressed	Timeline
Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ 3)	Communication; Gross Motor; Fine Motor; Problem-Solving; Personal Social	Must be administered within 45 days after enrollment and then at each classroom transition or at least once a year (preferably around a child's birth date).
Ages and Stages Questionnaire: Social Emotional (ASQ-SE)	Self-Regulation; Compliance; Communication; Adaptive Functioning; Autonomy	Must be administered within 45 days after enrollment and then at each classroom transition or at least once a year (preferably around a child's birth date).

- 1. Use the ASQ calculator to determine the child's adjusted age (http://asqagecalculator.com).
- 2. Using the Choosing the Correct Questionnaire document determine the correct questionnaire.
- 3. The teacher should complete the demographic information.
- 4. The screening should be administered in the child's natural environment.
- 5. Teacher should complete each question trying not to leave any blanks. Ask the parent(s) for input as needed.
- 6. The teacher gives the questionnaire to the Education Director to be scored and summary sheet completed.
- 7. The Education Director and/or teacher should share the results with the parent within a week of scoring and make any needed referrals (see referral process).
- 8. All documentation should be placed in the child's portfolio.
- 10. Education Director should check the child's portfolios at least once per month to ensure each individual child is up to date on developmental screenings according to the prescribed timeline.
