


Week:	Zoo Explorers!

Title:	Animal Books (Combine this packet with animal info in week 4 packet)
Supplies:	Various animal info documents
	Animal Info book page (blank)
	Writing utensils (Pencils, crayons, markers)
	YouTube Videos on animals, optional
	Printed world map per child
	Animal cutout page
	Scissors

Duration:	1 week, 30 minutes - 1 hour each day
Procedure:	During this week long lesson, the students will research animals and
	document their findings on the blank animal info page, creating a book!
	1. This lesson can be done in small groups or as a whole group.
	2. Put together the animal information document (there is a nonfiction
	version and a fiction version)
	3. Each day, focus on 2-3 animals.
	<ol> <li>Review animal information via reading the informational sheets and watching YouTube videos on the animal of the day.</li> </ol>
	5. Students will then use the included animal info sheet to record their
	learnings. Color document as they choose.
	6. Student will cut the animal from their animal squares, determine
	where they live in the world, and glue the animal to their world map.
	Feel free to have them color the map prior!
	7. Repeat steps 4 -6 each day.
	8. On Friday, have students put together their Zoo Animal Books to bring home!
	9. Don't forget to take a photo or make a copy of one of the pages for
	their portfolio!

	Understand the difference between fiction and nonfiction images.
































## the ELEPHANT

HAPITAT: Grasslands, Savanna

DIET: Plants, leaves, roots, and tree bark

**SIZE:** 8-11 feet and 6,000 - 15,000lbs



#### FUN FACTS

\* Can eat up to 500lbs of food per day

\* Can drink up to 50 gallons of water a day

\* Has large flat ears


\* The largest land mammal

## the GIRAFFE

HAPITAT: Grasslands, Savanna

DIET: Plants, leaves, roots, and tree bark

**SIZE:** 16 - 20 feet and 1,500 - 2,600 lbs



#### FUN FACTS

\* Tallest land animal

\* Has four stomachs to digest certain plants

> \* Can run up to 30 mph

\* Their tongue can be up to 18 inches long

## the MONKEY

HAPITAT: trees, mountains, forests

DIET: eggs, fruit, nuts, insects, and leaves

SIZE: 6 inches - over 3 feet



#### FUN FACTS

\* There are 264 different species of monkeys

\* Monkeys can be very loud and heard over a mile away

\* Monkeys can be very aggressive

\* Some monkeys have an IQ over 170.

## the CHEETAH

HAPITAT: Africa, grasslands, and forests

DIET: rabbits, gazelles, and birds

**SIZE:** 3 - 5 feet



#### FUN FACTS

\* They are the fastest land animal

\* Cheetahs have exceptional eye sight

\* They use so much energy sprinting, it lasts less than I minute

\* They can have 2-8 cubs at birth

## the LION

HAPITAT: Africa, grasslands, and savanna

DIET: zebras and large animals

**SIZE:** 280 - 500 lbs



#### FUN FACTS

\* Females do the hunting while the males protect the land and pride

\* Known as "King of the Jungle"

\* An adult male roar can be heard up to 5 miles

> \* Lions live in groups of 10-15 lions

## the ZEBRA

HAPITAT: Grasslands

DIET: plants, leaves, and trees

**SIZE:** 3-6 feet and 400 - 1000 lbs



#### FUN FACTS

\* Closely related to horses

\* Every zebra has their own pattern of stripes

\* Zebras can be very aggressive

\* They like to live in groups

## the FLAMINGO

HAPITAT: Coastal areas and lagoons

DIET: crustaceans and shrimp

SIZE: 4-5 feet tall but only 4-8 lbs



#### FUN FACTS

\* They eat by stirring the mud up with their feet

\* They get their pink color from the crustaceans they eat.

\* They will turn white in color if not eating shrimp or needed supplements

## the ALLIGATOR

HAPITAT: Rivers, lakes, ponds, swamps

DIET: fish, birds, other reptiles

SIZE: Can be over 12 feet and 1,000 lbs

#### FUN FACTS

\* They can swim up to 20 mph in the water \* All of its upper teeth can be seen when mouth is closed.



## the HIPPO

HAPITAT: River, lake, and swamp

**DIET**: grass

**SIZE:** 3,000 - 4,000 pounds

#### FUN FACTS

\* Their ears and nose are on top of their head so they can breath while submerged

\* Live in groups of 10-20 with one dominant male

\* Are great swimmers



## the GORILLA

**HABITAT:** Forests and Grassland areas

DIET: Plants, bamboo, and fruit

SIZE: up to 350 pounds



#### FUN FACTS


\* 98% DNA is matched to humans
